Tubal ligation is one of the most common forms of contraception for women in the United States. While the procedure is intended to be permanent, reversal is possible when performed by a physician with the proper training and experience. The Mississippi Fertility Institute is pleased to provide this highly specialized service to women who are thinking about pursuing a pregnancy after a previous tubal ligation.

Tubal reversal: the basics.

The feasibility of reversal surgery depends on the type of tubal ligation you've undergone. The most common techniques involve removing a segment of each Fallopian tube. Other techniques involve burning the tubes or simply blocking them with clips or bands. When it comes to the successful reversal of a tubal ligation, each technique presents its own set of challenges. And a successful reversal can only be accomplished by a physician with the proper training and experience.

Typically, tubal reversal is an outpatient surgery procedure requiring anesthesia and a small incision in the bikini area. Discharge usually takes place the next morning. Sexual activity can resume after 2 to 4 weeks, but pregnancy should not be attempted for at least 6 weeks to allow time for the fallopian tubes to heal properly.

Pregnancy after tubal ligation: we can help.

Although it may take up to 18 months after surgery for conception to occur, fully 60% of patients receiving tubal reversal ultimately conceive. Tubal or ectopic pregnancy complicates approximately 5% of these pregnancies. Our comprehensive screening process, state-of-the-art medical equipment and physician expertise make us an excellent choice for women having second thoughts about their previous choice of surgical contraception.

Reversing the irreversible.

Tubal reversal allows a woman to attempt pregnancy naturally, but requires surgery and several weeks of recuperation. But corrective surgery isn't the only option for a woman who has undergone a tubal ligation. In vitro fertilization avoids surgery and the associated recuperation period, and can achieve similar pregnancy rates more quickly.
